Last week I was with many of our interim pastors as we continued to acquaint ourselves with the new Local Church Profile. One of the changes from the 'vintage' Local Church Profile is the disappearance of the 'List of Leadership' Expectations'. Perhaps you remember that list. It began with 'Our Church needs a person who...' followed by a list of 43 attributes. Every member of the church was to choose their top twelve desires. Those were gathered and collated by the Search Committee and the Local Church Profile put an X beside the top twelve congregational desires. I have almost always heard, 'How can we choose just twelve. We want all of them!' At the same time, the Ministerial Profile also had that same list and the candidate was supposed to mark X beside their top leadership attributes. And in the end,

both Search Committees and Candidates wondered how helpful the exercise was.

Well, two years ago a new Ministerial Profile was unveiled. Guess what was left out? You are right! That list was left out. And guess what else? It's been left out of the new Local Church Profile as well.

The group that has been working on this new profile for the last two years realized that this list of 43 expectations was a maintenance-based list of those attributes and desires that will keep us satisfied.

I'm not sure that Jesus came to keep us satisfied. And I'm not sure that Jesus is very satisfied when observing his Body on earth, the church, resting in comfortable ruts and routines that simply satisfy us.

I'm pretty sure that Jesus came to wake us up to the ways we are much too comfortable while allowing too many others to be uncomfortable, unwanted, afraid and hopeless.

So what does the local church need to wake us up? Both of these new Profiles - both Local Church and Ministerial - refer to something called "Marks of Faithful and Effective Ministry'. Our Church and Ministry Committees are already using these Marks with their Members in Discernment as they observe and discern MID's growing and deepening practice and integration and sometime even passion in vital areas of ministry and faithful discipleship. These Marks correlate with what the United Church of Christ learned from our most vital and vibrant churches and pastors. Churches that were large and small and in between. Churches that were rural, suburban and urban. Churches in every geographic area of our country.

Did you notice 7, 9, 10, 11? They are the places where people gather to build relationship with God and one another that fuel the rest of the list! Last Sunday I worshipped in Dummerston where they had just welcomed Rev. Shawn Bracebridge as their new pastor. Following worship they held their quarterly congregational meeting. It was a check-in on their 2016-2017 goals. How were they doing? They were able to cross off 'search for and call a new pastor! Were they missing anything? One suggested that they needed to find a way to be nourished in faith together between worship services. Perhaps lay led Bible Studies since their new pastor had enough else to do? He volunteered to lead one.

Prayer, Bible and God Talk tucked into every corner of a church's life is the leaven - the yeast - that can make a difference - it is powerful as it ferments and becomes contagious as it touches every single bit of flour. Something grows that may not be comfortable or safe - but it will definitely make a difference in the lives of those inside and outside that congregation.

So - in case you haven't noticed - something new has been added to the UCC Daily Devotional (sign up here). Monday's Daily Devotional includes suggestions for Small Group Discussions. Whatever group is meeting that week - why not add that conversation to the agenda. There is something called 'Congregations Weekly - sparking ministry conversations'. This provides a thought starter from one of our national staff - in their area of ministry - and ends with a couple of questions for conversations in your monthly Council, Trustee, Deacon, CE, Mission, etc. meetings.

Sunday, January 29th was Beverly Anderson's last Sunday at the Bridgewater Congregational Church as she is retiring. We'll do this again in a few weeks at Sherburne United Church of Christ. It was no accident that the lectionary included Bev's favorite passage from Micah. Well done, good and faithful servant!

The UCC has a new video - Trading Places - a very timely conversation starter - in light of recent executive orders and demonstrations and has a helpful study guide.

Of course, there are always Bible studies, Lectionary study groups, Book Reads, Prayer groups - there is a place for everyone in this vision of being Church together.

The more we engage one another in faith conversations in our local church it becomes the yeast of the Kingdom of God being mixed into the flour of your congregation and your community.

And the result? Just imagine how many loaves of bread can be baked and broken in extravagant welcome and continuing testimony of the Good News of Jesus Christ! That would be the number of loaves that result from yeast mixed into the flour that would fill one and a half Roman bushels. Intervarsity Press reports that three measures of flour equals 50 pounds of flour - enough bread for 100 people. And Amy Jill Levine, in her Jewish Annotated New Testament reports that three measures is 60 pounds! Yes, it takes time and patience to knead the yeast into 60 pounds of flour and to let it rise into its fullness.

But Jesus is not about satisfaction. Jesus is about abundance shared with the whole world.



#### It's UCC Yearbook Time!

The United Church of Christ's annual Yearbook is the central reference point for the UCC for information about churches, ministers and other data the UCC uses to better understand the health of our denomination and identify trends as we all plan for the future.

The UCC Yearbook relies upon all UCC churches, associations and conferences to submit their statistical information at the beginning of each year so the reference data is as accurate as possible. Using the UCC Data Hub, churches may upload their information directly for the Yearbook.

The Vermont Conference asks that every church in our Conference participate in the UCC Yearbook information submission effort. Each church should designate one person to be responsible for this effort and notify Jesse Davis at the Vermont Conference so he can be a resource to them. Jesse will be in contact with these designated people as the Yearbook process moves forward. The UCC Center for Analytics, Research and Data (CARD) has made resources available to take you step by step through the data upload process in the UCC Data Hub.
