This is the first in a series of reflections from the Vermont Conference General Synod delegates on their experience as part of the biennial national gathering of the United Church of Christ held in Baltimore June 29-July 4th.

As a delegate to this year's Synod, I am grateful to have received the privilege of witnessing the legislative process that drives the national agenda of the United Church of Christ. Within those working cogs I got to see our church functioning in a way that was at times inspired, bold and brave, while at other times contentious and even deceitful. I saw our denomination take steps back and steps forward but always this was something that we did together, soulfully as a body of searchers attempting to find our way closer to God's ideal for us in the world. I will not say that Synod was a clean and orderly process, but rather it was as functional as human relations tend to be and, in its own way, that is an inspiring thing.

During the week I was in Baltimore, I spent a lot of it either in committee where we worked on revising resolutions to present to the Synod floor, or in plenary debating or discussing the different resolutions that were being presented. The thing that made this interesting was that this Synod seemed to have no shortage of controversial resolutions; from speaking out against the incarceration of Palestinian children, or changing the UCC standards of giving, or speaking to the rights of adult adoptees to see their original birth records, all of which triggered a cacophony of

discussion, and each discussion consisted of representatives from all the conferences in the UCC standing up and telling us a story about themselves within the span of sixty seconds.

Synod youth stewards help keep business running smoothly

I listened to a lot of stories over the Synod week, most of which were personal; which led me to realize that most of the delegates on the floor, or at least, most of the delegates who stood to speak, were voting from personal convictions. Each of these people wanted us to hear his or her stories because within each of these resolutions they were able to see themselves. They were reaching out to their brothers and sisters within the UCC seeking to affirm their faith in God as they understood it by sharing that faith with us. Some of these stories I could connect with, other I could not. Some people were guarded in sharing their stories, and others seemed to have a story for each and every issue. But everyone present was vested in what we were doing because we understood that the statements we made at Synod represented an institution we all chose to be a part of, and thus they represented a part of not only us making the resolution but all people in association with the United Church of Christ. And so, regardless of the means, I could see the motive behind the process. This Synod was meant to bring people together and it did exactly that.
