Dear Beloved Community in the Vermont Conference,

Traci will be offering a keynote address, leading a time for questions and answers and preaching at our main worship service with communion. We will also have a panel of People of Color who live and work in Vermont to talk about their experiences of racism. Throughout the meeting we will share in powerful worship and be wrapped in innovative music with **Dr. Chris Backriges and friends.** Chris is an ethnomusicologist and the music director for the West Dover Congregational Church, UCC.

Finally, we need to get ready to have the conversation about white privilege and the justice God desires. This is not easy work and I know I stumble all the time and have to start again.

For Lent this year, I am committed to completing a 28 day reflection and journaling exercise using the resources: *Me and White Supremacy: Combat racism, Change the World and Become a Good Ancestor* by Layla Saad. The workbook is available for free download through Kindle books or the book will become available in a few days for purchase. I AM HOPING MANY OF US WILL COMMIT TO THIS SELF-REFLECTIVE STUDY DURING LENT in preparation for Annual Meeting. There is also a guide available for those who would like to use the resource as a group study. Several members of the Conference Board of Directors have already made this commitment, and some are planning to use this book for a Lenten study at their churches.




