Dear Members of the Beloved Community in the Vermont Conference.

As we draw near to the presidential election, I hope we will all take time for prayer, to remember what voting means for us and what it means to those long denied the right to vote. Some of our siblings in faith have long struggled to



exercise their right to vote. First, by not being recognized as human. Then being deceived, intimidated and beaten to represent their vote. Lest we think of this as history only, there are multiple tactics being used to suppress the voting rights of black men and women and other people of color right now.

There are three things I ask us all to do. First, vote. Voting is a privilege, a right, and a way we express our deepest values not merely personally, but

as an expression of loving our neighbors as we love ourselves. We need to ask ourselves, what is the good, the just for all of God's children, for we are our siblings' keeper.

Second, please watch this video production by Rev. Dr. Otis Moss. The Rev. Traci Blackmon who will be our speaker at our 2021 Annual Meeting says, "I cannot stop weeping. Lastly, do everything you can to get out the vote and when you have, pray. Remember we have the "20 Days of Nonpartisan Prayer" resource on our website. I know my small weekly meditation group will be meeting the day before, the day of and the day after the election to hold this nation in Love. I hope you will find your way to do so as well.

People of God, may we always be found in those places that require courage in the struggle for justice and peace. May we always be found rooted and grounded in Love. May we always remember that we are never alone.

Peacemaker's Pulpit - October 2020

The wonderful Willem Lange tells of a group of eight-year-old boys in a Sunday School class playing a game called "I Can Stop the Hurt". The boys stood in a circle, shoulder to shoulder. The game began when one boy punched the shoulder

of the boy next to him, who then did the same (a little harder) to the one next to him, and on it went.

When they'd made it once around the circle, the teacher said to them, "When it is your turn, you can end the game by saying, 'I can stop the hurt. Do that and the game will be over."

Round two began and then round three, the blows landing with increasing force. It seemed it would never end.

Finally, one of them blurted out, "I can stop the hurt!" With that, the game was over. And the boy who ended it, instead of being shamed, was celebrated, and became a hero to his peers.

"Kids recognize courage at least as quickly as the rest of us", Lange observed.

Indeed, making peace takes courage.

It takes courage to break the cycle of violence.

It takes courage to refrain from repaying evil for evil.

It takes courage to speak truth to power.

Around our tables, across our nation, throughout our planet...may we summon the courage to stop the hurt.

I pray you courage in the struggle...


(<u>https://firstchurchburlington.org/</u>) extends an open invitation to any congregation in need of a respite Sunday for your pastor.

Kipah, Kufi, and Collar

As part of an interfaith effort at modeling peace, Rabbi Amy Small of Ohavi Zedek, Imam Islam Hassan of the Islamic Society of Vermont, and Pastor Ken White of College Street Congregational Church in Burlington have released a podcast called "Kipah, Kufi, and Collar". Each 30 minute segment starts with Amy, Islam, and Ken having a conversation about an everyday issue (week 1 is "how to deal with difficult people") and then interviewing a local figure about that same topic (week 1's guest is former Vermont Governor, U.S. Ambassador, professor and author Madeline Kunin).
