Message from Our Conference Fall/Winter November 19, 2020

Did you know that the first African American to be ordained in the United States served in our Vermont Conference for most of his ministry? Lemuel Haynes (1753-1833) grew up in Connecticut, served in the American Revolution, and then was ordained by the Congregational Church in Torrington, Connecticut in 1785. He went on to serve that church as pastor for 3 years.

He then accepted a call to the West Rutland Congregational Church in Vermont, where he served as pastor for 30 years to a mostly white congregation. In addition to preaching the Gospel, he was a strong anti-slavery activist. In 1804, Middlebury College awarded him an honorary Master of Arts, the first honorary degree ever bestowed by a college on an African-American in the United States. At the conclusion of his ministry in West Rutland in 1818, he served as a temporary pastor in Manchester, VT, before finishing his ordained ministry at the South Granville church in South Granville, NY. He was still serving there at the age of 80 when he died!

The Southwest Association, which includes the two churches in Vermont where he served, plans to commemorate his ministry in some way this upcoming year, though obviously this is dependent on how Covid is affecting us all. In the midst of all that we are currently facing, it is good to remember a faithful servant of the Church before us who faced so much, and yet made such a difference in the lives of so many. It is something to be truly thankful for!

Tenacity

Hello, Conference folks!

From time to time, when I feel that the world's pain is too much to bear or share, I listen to a You Tube clip of the Kuumba Singers singing 'Hold On' with Bobby McFerrin as soloist. They were performing on an outdoor stage in Leipzig, Germany in 2002. The words are simple:

Hold on just a little while longer.. (3x) ...everything will be all right.

Pray on just a little while longer...

Fight on just a little while longer... Sing on just a little while longer...



Old E-mail Phishing Scam Going Around Again

Please be vigilant about any email that appears to be from your clergy person or our conference minister or staff, asking you to take some kind of unusual action (purchasing gift cards and replying with the serial numbers, clicking a link or downloading an attachment you didn't request, wiring money to a specified account, or simply replying quickly).

A number of congregations across our conference and the country have been hit with an email scam. It involves making a fake Gmail (or yahoo, etc.) account in the minister's name and then sending a request for gift cards allegedly from that minister to the congregation's directory. The emails seem harmless; they have the local pastor's name and an email address that looks legitimate, but upon further inspection, the email address is actually from a provider different than the one the church typically uses.

In some instances, the sender's name may look correct but is missing a single letter. Or otherwise closely resembles the real email address; for example, joe@churchstaff.org becomes joechurchstaff@gmail.com. In some cases, the message asks for Google Play or iTunes gift cards and in other cases, it asks the recipient to contact them immediately.

DOs and DON'Ts:

DO double-check your emails carefully.

DON'T ever respond to an email asking you for money.

DO verify in person or by phone any request involving money or personal information. DON'T reply.

DON'T click on any links within the message.

DO report the message as spam to your email provider after forwarding it to the Federal Trade

Commission at spam@uce.gov - be sure to cc the church being impersonated.

These scams attack the trust and faith you place in certain respected people. Be safe out there in cyberspace.

COVID-19 - RESOURCES BEFORE RETURNING TO IN-PERSON WORSHIP -TRAINING PACKAGE-

In many states it is required to provide COVID-19 training to your leadership, staff and volunteers prior to reopening. By providing this training you will minimize the legal burden, but more importantly you are providing a safe place to work and worship. The Insurance Board spent months developing this high-quality training to help churches and ministries like yours to reopen safely.

The video provides a completion certificate for each viewing, which can help satisfy training requirements mandated by certain States. In addition to protecting ministries by reducing the likelihood of COVID-19 related claims, it also provides documentation for necessary steps taken by the church to best demonstrate preparedness and precautions taken for a safe return to worship.

There is also a companion video for staff and volunteers on "Considerations for Preventing COVID-19 in Your Ministry." Member denominations may access the license to view the videos through our partnership with myCEcourse.com at a discounted price of \$2.50. All other ministries may access the video for the low cost of \$5.
